## **ABOUT SHIRO**

Shiro is a graffiti artist from Japan. Her vibrant imagery reflects her love for old school Hip-Hop culture and graffiti, revolving around her original character "Mimi", a dynamic and strong role model of womanhood.

Since 1998, she has divided her time between New York and Japan. Her first stay in Queens and Brooklyn was in 2002-4 when she had the opportunity to work with many great graffiti artists who inspired her to develop her own style. She later would take periodic sabbaticals from her profession as a registered nurse in Japan to visit and work as an artist in New York.

In Japan, Shiro has worked with members of the Japanese and Asian Hip-Hop industries, organizing shows and live events. She currently lives in New York and has brought her art to 18 different countries to date with more to come, cementing her place as an esteemed international artist.
